## **The National School of Leaders**

During my time as Lay Director of the Ottawa Cursillo Movement (2021-2022), internet searches were initiated of other Cursillo Movements across Canada and the US to learn how others were coping with the restrictions imposed by COVID. In this process, one stumbled upon the Canadian Conference of Catholic Cursillos(<a href="https://cursillocanada.org/">https://cursillocanada.org/</a>) and the National Cursillo Movement USA website (<a href="National Cursillo USA">National Cursillo USA</a>). The Canadian and American Cursillo Websites provided me with a treasury of information.

An announcement of a Mini Conference on the website of the Canadian Conference of Catholic Cursillos (https://cursillocanada.org/) in the fall of 2022 caught my attention. Being eager and curious about Cursillo, I attended this event held in Grande Prairie AB.

As a veteran of numerous Cursillo teams both as a team member and kitchen detail person, I believed I knew much about Cursillo. My prior involvement in numerous local Cursillo events helped me understand the **how** of Cursillo. The information gained at the conference, proved to me that I knew **little** about Cursillo. It became abundantly clear that I had much to learn about the **why** of Cursillo and the vision for Cursillo that our, Founder Edwardo Bonnin, spent his lifetime developing.

Following my participation at this mini conference, links to the National School of Leaders presentations continue to be forwarded to me, which were shared with members of our Movement.

Past topics have included: The Criteria for Cursillo Decisions; The Woman at the Well – How to Encounter Others; The History of the Study of the Environment Rollo, The Environment Rollo; Pre Cursillo 1; Post Cursillo 1; Post Cursillo 2; The Three Encounters of Cursillo Weekend; Leaders who Think; and The Third Day.

Cursillo, as a short course in the Fundamentals of Christian Living, is a field of study like education, catechesis, or religious education. The concepts and practises of Cursillo as a discipline or school of thought are discussed, analyzed and communicated in the various newsletters, books and pamphlets found in the resources section of the CCCC's <a href="Catologue-April-2023-.pdf">Catologue-April-2023-.pdf</a> as well as the <a href="Cursillo Literature">Cursillo Literature</a> | Catholic Cursillo Books. These lists contain a treasury of worthwhile reading.

The Officers group of the CCCC is planning a Cursillo Conference during the summer of 2025, to be held in London Ontario. More information will be shared as it becomes available.

Participation in the NSOL presentations and attendance of the 2025 summer Conference will increase my understanding and appreciation for the beautiful gift of Cursillo which Our Lord gave us through the lifetime work of Edwardo Bonnin (1917 – 2008).

## **Unexpected Christmas Blessings**

When someone asks about favorite Christmas memories, they often include a favorite present, spending time with loved ones and rejoicing that Christ came into the world. For me, one of my favorite memories occurred a few years ago due to an unexpected phone call.

December 25, 2021 was one of the "COVID" Christmases, where gathering together was severely limited, both in homes and in churches. On Christmas Eve, as my parents and I were preparing our celebration for the next day, we received a phone call from our parish priest at St. Maurice, Fr. Tim Devine. The priests in the rectory had their meal plans fall through and were caught in a bind and Fr. Tim took it upon himself to reach out to see what could be done. Fr. Jerry Gauvreau, who was in residence at the time, couldn't believe that Fr. Tim was reaching out on Christmas Eve to people who were busy planning their own festivities. Nonetheless, Fr. Tim knew that someone out there would respond in kind; it just so happened that we were the ones who did.

Having already prepared most of our meal, we had enough to spare, so we put together take out versions of our meal for the 3 priests. They received a classic Christmas dinner: turkey, potatoes, veggies and apple pie for dessert. The next step was delivering the meal to them...which proved interesting because there was inclement weather on Christmas night. So, braving the elements, we drove to St. Maurice and brought the food in containers and delivered it inside to them. They weren't expecting the meal that they received, and they were very appreciative.

As Christmas was on a Saturday, we ended up seeing them the next day at Sunday Mass. The final verdict on the meal was that it was delicious, nobody got sick and that they were all grateful for the hospitality we provided to them.

I share this story for 2 reasons; first, this will be the last edition of The Fourth Day before Christmas, so I wanted to include a Christmas memory. But secondly, and most importantly, I share this to highlight that some of the best memories and experiences can be borne out of unexpected opportunities, and how we choose to respond can have an impact that can affect people in ways that you would never expect.

As we approach Christmas in 2024, may your Christmas season be filled with joy, may it be a time spent with those you care about most and as the calendar turns to 2025, may our Cursillo community be blessed abundantly and may we respond to the opportunities that God has in store for us.

## **Ottawa Area Ultreyas**

The Ultreya, together with Group Reunion, make up the Cursillo Method, unique to Cursillo, helping Cursillistas to persevere on their 'Fourth Day' pilgrimage. The Ultreya is a meeting place for Christians who share a common experience and goal. The Ultreya is where we renew friendships and where we are inspired by the 'story' of a fellow pilgrim whose testimony is supported by others. It can also be the place to start a new Group Reunion for those seeking "companions on the journey". Ultreyas are monthly or bimonthly—whatever meets the needs of the Cursillo community. Sometimes called 'the gathering of the groups', ultreyas are a great place to receive and give support, especially for those not yet in a group or between groups.

An ultreya has three basic parts; (1) meeting and sharing in floating group reunions, (2) listening to a witness (Fourth Day) talk and the responses, and (3) praying together with community intentions.

Ultreya' means 'onward' or 'keep on going'. Come whenever you can to gather in friendship where you will be encouraged on your pilgrimage. See the list below.
